Staff General Expectations

The Huntingdon County CTC will use asynchronous participation for the majority of the programs with the exception being the cosmetology program which will follow a synchronous approach.

- Asynchronous Students can access their learning and interact with assignments at any time and would receive feedback from their teacher at another time. Asynchronous instruction, in the form of assigned readings, independent practice, and self-paced lessons will take place each day.
- Synchronous - Students can access their learning and interact with assignments at a specific
 time and receive real-time feedback. Synchronous instruction, in the form of direct instruction –
 live or pre-recorded, will also take place daily.

All staff including but not limited teachers and Para educators are required to plan and moderate assignments / projects as determined by individual program instructors. Teachers and Para's are expected to have available time (office hours) for students to participate and/or ask questions about assignments and/or have meaningful interaction with their instructor.

Student Expectations

The Huntingdon County Career and Technology Center Continuity of Education Plan will begin on April 6, 2020 and will follow the current school calendar. Students are expected to:

- Complete assigned work to the best of their ability. That being said there are many factors which may hinder or impede this. For those students with connectivity issues or computer access problems there will be modifications and adaptations to address those issues.
- Communicate with their instructors as needed.
- Stay safe and continue to practice social distancing when in an environment where this is required.

Attendance / Accountability

Attendance:

Student participation in the continuity of education plan is required. Attendance will be taken through weekly check-ins and through the completion of assignments.

Grading:

- We will utilize PASS/FAIL approach for assessment, utilizing only formative assessment with an emphasis on high quality specific feedback for learning. The threshold for passing will be a 70%.
- When assessing our students' work, what would typically qualify as a 70% or higher will be a passing grade.
- Any student who does not meet the 70% threshold will be afforded the opportunity to resubmit work to demonstrate their understanding and earn a passing grade.
- For students who choose not to participate or submit work, a FAILING grade will be assigned.

Our primary focus is on student enrichment - NOT grades.

Good Faith Efforts for Access and Equity for All Students

The Huntingdon County CTC, in partnership with our sending school districts, Huntingdon Area, Mount Union, Southern Huntingdon, and Juniata Valley is committed to providing Good Faith Efforts for Access and Equity for All Students. Specifically, Huntingdon County CTC will to the greatest extend possible, work to ensure each student with a disability will be provided the special education and related services identified in the student's Individualized Education Plan (IEP) or Section 504 Plan.

Through our sending school districts, HCCTC will provide access to necessary technology resources for all students and consistently at regular intervals, communicate with all students to make every attempt to provide reasonable and appropriate education based on student need and circumstances.

We believe that this experiment with virtual enrichment will prove better for all students in the present circumstances than doing nothing. We anticipate encountering difficulties with this roll-out, although just what difficulties remains to be seen. We feel that with flexibility, cooperation and understanding, we will be able to keep us all moving in a positive trajectory.
